

The mission of the CT Lacrosse Hall of Fame is to honor men and women, past and present, who by their deeds as players, coaches, officials or administrators have contributed to the growth of lacrosse in Connecticut and the stature of Connecticut lacrosse nationally, and who by the example of their lives, personify the great contribution of lacrosse to our way of life.

Candidates may be nominated in one of the following categories:

- 1) A truly great player
- 2) A truly great coach
- 3) A truly great official/umpire
- 4) A truly great contributor

In order to be nominated, a Nominee Questionnaire must be submitted by, or on behalf of, a candidate. The CT Chapter website lists the criteria for each category and has all the information you need to complete and submit a Nominee Questionnaire.

Nominations are due by **February 15**th of each year and candidates are reviewed in March. The class is selected by a committee vote in April and the Hall of Fame inductees are then honored at a dinner.







